

Testing Schedule FAQs for Families (Spring)

Which students are required to test?

All students in semester 2 or year long: Math I or II, English 9 or 10, American Government, Biology or American History are required by state law to test. Students who are enrolled in AP American Government or AP American History are not required to take the AIR tests, since they will take the AP exam in May.

Which AIR tests are offered each day?

- April 10th - English 9/10 - testing schedule A *210 minute test
- April 19th - Math I / II - testing schedule B *180 minute test
- April 20th - American Government - testing schedule A *180 minute test
- April 21st - Biology / American History- testing schedule B *180 minute test

What should students bring/not bring on the testing days?

Bring → Pencil, calculator for the math test, headphones for all tests except English, and work not related to the test content to complete if a student finishes early.

Do not Bring → Any electronic device (phone, chromebook, laptop, etc.) or homework related to the test content.

What is the bell schedule during the testing days?

Where will students test?

Testing will occur in classrooms; classroom assignments will be posted on the cafeteria windows on April 6th

If students do not have a test when do they arrive?

Students who do not have a test on the respective day will have a late arrival. Classes begin at 11:50 on Monday April 10th then 11:35 during the 2nd week of testing (April 19th-21st)

Why is the time longer on April 10th?

The English Language Arts I/II test, these tests are 30 minutes longer than the rest.

When and who will eat lunch each day?

Students who are testing and those that arrive early will be able to eat lunch each day. Only one lunch will be offered. Students who arrive late (after 11:00) should eat lunch prior to arriving.

What is the bus schedule on these days?

All buses will arrive and pick at up normal times each day.

What if my student does not have any other transportation means besides the bus and does not have to test?

Students who do not have a test and arrive at normal time will be monitored in the cafeteria during testing.

Which doors will be open at late arrival?

Both the back and front doors will be open during these respective times. Entrances will be monitored by staff.

Monday April 10th from 11:15-11:50, and then the second week of testing they will be open from 11:00-11:35.

What classes will the students have each day?

To help maintain the block schedule following testing students will have 2nd then 1st blocks on Monday April 10th and Thursday April 20th, and then will have 3rd and 4th blocks on Wednesday April 19th and Friday April 21st.
